### CANS 2016 IACCT Clinical Re-Assessment and Recommendations Tool

#### Guidance for Use of this Grid

The purpose of this IACCT Clinical Re-Assessment and Recommendation Tool is to allow the IACCT LMHP to examine the Magellan CANS Assessment Report and engage in the following process:

1. Review information gathered on the CANS during the IACCT assessment process
  - a. The current CANS report will have the baseline, most recent, and current scores for each item
  - b. Identify all items which are a “3” as needing immediate attention (in **BOLD** in end summary)
  - c. For reassessments, notate areas in which the youth has improved or has newly identified needs at this time
  
2. Make recommendations to the IACCT team and Residential Placement as to treatment areas and/or interventions that can support gains for the youth and family based on areas of need and strength identified on the most recent CANS
  - a. Consider immediate (“3”) and primary needs in your formulation of clinical needs and recommendations on interventions
  - b. Include intervention timelines
  - c. Include information on discussion with the family and youth on CANS identified needs and strengths for their involvement in the plan of care
  
3. Include these recommendations as part of the re-assessment and submit to the IACCT Intensive Care Manager (ICM) within 3 business days of the 90 day requirement for reassessment or within 3 business days of the date the reassessment is requested by the ICM if an earlier reassessment is needed.
